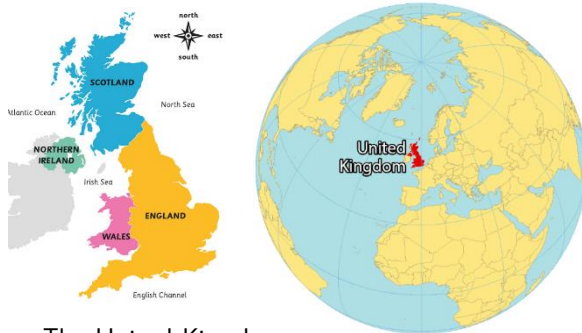

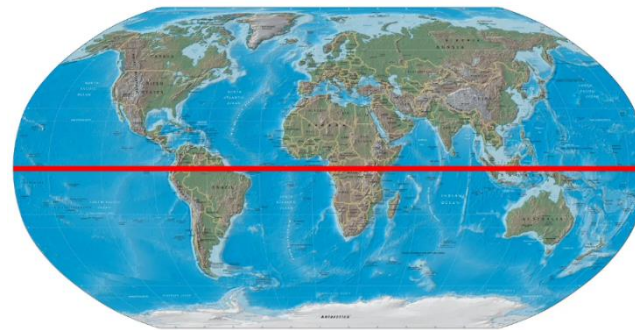

The equator is an imaginary line in the middle of a planet. On planet Earth, it is half way between the North and South pole and shows where the sun's rays are at their hottest.



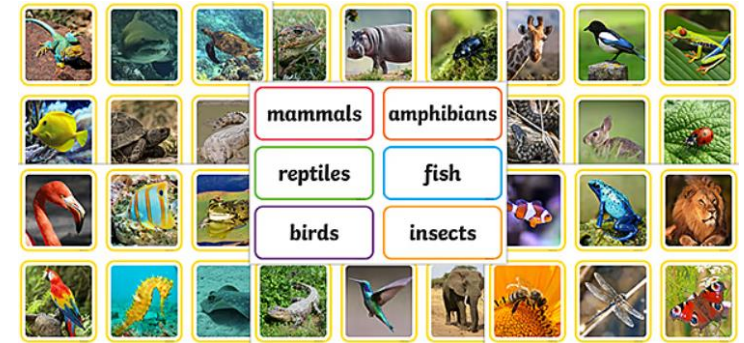
Understand weather differences between countries like the UK and Africa/Australia and how the position of these countries is linked with the equator.



Our key Science knowledge in our topic:

A habitat is somewhere that something can live, which will allow their basic needs to be met, such as providing them with shelter, food, water, safety or warmth.

Animals can be categorised into different animal groups according to their characteristics.



Nocturnal animals are awake at night and sleep during the day.

Carnivores eat meat. Herbivores eat plants, seeds, fruits and nuts. Omnivores eat both meat and plants.
