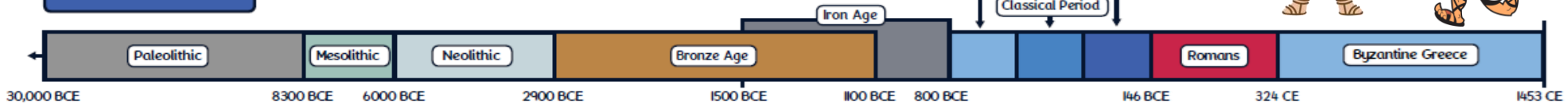

Ancient	Something from a very long time ago.
Civilisation	human society with well-developed rules and government, often where technology and the arts are considered important.
City states	Small areas that ancient Greece was divided into, each with their own governments, laws and army.
Empire	A group of countries or states that are ruled by one ruler or country.
Legacies	Things that exist after someone dies or after a civilisation or event ends.
Democracy	A system where the citizens of a country or state are involved in the way it is run.
Myth	A story from ancient times about something that happened long ago that some people believed to be true.

Greek Gods

<u>Zeus</u> King of the Greek Gods. God of the sky and thunder.	<u>Hades</u> Brother of Zeus and God of the Underworld.
<u>Poseidon</u> Brother of Zeus. God of the sea, earthquakes and horses.	<u>Hera</u> Wife of Zeus. Queen of Mount Olympus.
<u>Apollo</u> Greek God of Music, poetry, light, prophecy and medicine.	<u>Aphrodite</u> Greek God of Love and beauty. Famous for being the most beautiful.



Alexander the Great
Known as the Ruler of the World and the most successful Empire builders. One of the greatest military leaders of all time.

Socrates

One of the most influential founders of Western philosophy.

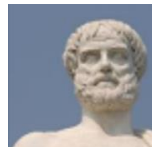


Plato
